This edition focuses on Art. Our subject lead is: Mrs Hargreaves




At The Oaklands, we love art! We know the power of art and how children love being creative.

We have enhanced our art curriculum even further by using a new art program called Kapow Art. We have already seem the huge improvement in the quality of artwork being produced across the whole school, from Nursery to year 6. Pupils are abel to talk about the new skills and knowledge they are learning and comment on the techniques and works of artists from across the world.

Our Art curriculum supports pupils in:

- Generating ideas and using sketchbooks, taking inspiration from a range of artists
- Making skills: drawing, painting, printmaking, photography, mixed media, craft techniques and sculpture
- **Learning formal elements:** for example: colour, form, line, pattern, shape, texture and tone
- Knowledge of artists' work and techniques
- Evaluating: critiquing their own work and that of others





The Nursery children have had a wonderful term. We have finished our 'Build It Up' project where they learnt about different buildings, their features, strong and weak material and how to

join things together using: tape, glue and string. We focused on two more books which were; The Three Billy Goats Gruff and What We'll Build. They had great fun pretending to be the troll on the obstacle course and joining different boxes together to make houses. We look forward to out next project 'Are Eggs Alive'



This half-terms Project, Once upon a time, has been a real hit! The children

have engaged well with their development of Expressive Arts and Design. In particular, the children have amazed us with their creativity when designing and threading to make their very own puppets. They were very excited when making their own stories in our puppet theatres, and even enjoyed 'buying' snacks when watching the actors! In writing the children have loved making porridge, tasting it, then writing instructions for the three bears. The children's maths continues to develop, and they have now been introduced to numbers 0-8 by creating their own number tracks. Well done superstars!

As part of our current geography project, Bright Lights, Big City, Year 1 enjoyed a walk to the local park.

We spotted human geographical features and lots of wildlife. We have used this to help us write a recount.





In Year 2 this half term, our project was 'Wriggle and Crawl'. We have learnt lots of interesting facts all about different animals and their habitats, for example a white-faced scops owl is diurnal. We have also been working towards writing a detailed recount of our visit from The Animal Man. Within our singing lessons, we have been learning two songs all

about minibeasts. In Design and Technology, we have been using pivots, levers and linkages to design, make and evaluate our own moving minibeasts. Our project next half term will be 'Movers and Shakers'. We are looking forward to a special workshop on Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> February.

Y3 have been very productive over the last few weeks, learning all about the different types of soil that we have in this country, as well as the three main types of rock! We can name igneous, sedimentary and metamorphic! We have also been working

hard at our fractions knowledge, learning how to find fractions of amounts and working out what equivalent fractions are, too!



The last couple of weeks have been a busy time for Year 4 but that has also meant that it has been full of excitement! We were lucky enough to visit Ninestiles Academy this week to watch a performance of Matilda. As soon as the perfor-



mance finished, we had children asking when they could see it again. Just like our last trip to the Think Tank, the children showed great behaviour on the walk and also when they were seated. Well done Year 4 – half way through!

We have been having a lot of fun with our D.T. projects this week and have all created Electric Doodlers. To do this, year 5 have

built their knowledge of series circuits, tested the best form and function of a doodler, and then put everything they learnt into practice in developing their own doodlers. Look on ClassDojo for some of the great examples of the doodlers

we have made.

'All things are difficult before they become easy' - well done to our Year 5 for your persistence with work.



The children have worked incredibly hard and we are so very proud of all

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their achievements. Some our highlights

have been working with the Guardian Newspaper in which the children learnt so many journalistic skills and even dressed as journalists for the day! They have been encouraged to go home and teach their parents and siblings about fact checking websites, how to conduct interviews without judgement, and how to assess whether a report is biased or not. It has been a hugely empowering experience for them. Many thanks to the parents who came in for the workshop.
