- 23rd November—Flu Vaccinations


In Reading, we will be learning:

- Phase 5 alternative sounds e.g. ir, ie, ay
- Fluency—reading without the need to segment and blend
- Prosody—using a story telling voice when reading, using expression and a varying tone of voice
- Comprehension—understanding what we have read and answering questions using retrieval, inference and prediction skills.



In Maths, we will be learning about:

- Numbers and the number system, focusing on numbers to 20 and using number lines.
- Addition and Subtraction within 20 and number bonds to make 20.
- Exploring time, particularly days of the week, months of the year and sequencing in chronological order.
- Mathematical movement, focusing on whole turns, half turns, quarter turns and three-quarter turns and how we can describe these.



In Writing, we will be learning about:

How to write instructions:

Based on 'How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth'. This will include identifying the features of a good set of instructions (chronology, conjunctions, punctuation, imperative verbs) and using those to write our own in-



How to write a diary entry:

structions.

We will be writing about a familiar event, and ensuring we use the features of a diary entry e.g. writing in the past tense, writing in the first person, writing in chronological order and describing thoughts, feelings and emotions.

Our main subject we will be focusing on is: History

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- Changes within history and living memory including exploring toys from the past.
- Historical language to describe the passing of time.
