In Maths, we will be learning about:

Mental recall: Adding a three-digit number and a one-digit number. Subtracting a one-digit number from a three-digit number.

Numbers and the number system

Recognising the place value of each digit in at three-digit number.

Reading and writing numbers up to 1000 in numerals and in words.

Calculating: Addition and Subtraction.

Reading and writing the time to five minutes.



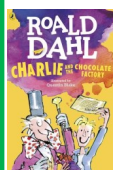
In Writing, we will be learning about:

Instructions - imperative verbs, bullet points, chronological order.

Recounts - simple past tense, use of chronological order, time connectives, first and third person.

Narratives - simple past tense, expanded noun phrases, similes, adverbials of time and place.

In Reading, we will be learning about:



Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, focusing on:

Vocabulary - how words are used in the story and how we can explain the meanings of words.

Retrieval of information - how to skim and scan a text for more information.

Inference from a text - reading between the lines.

Summarising a text - how we explain a long text and explaining it in a few sentences.

Explaining a text - identifying themes of a text.

Hérons are reading: The Boy who Grew Dragons.

Kingfishers are reading: The Chronicles of Narnia.

Recipe: APPLE PIE		by Jeanine Clark
Ingredients	Instructions	
<p>CRUST: 3 c flour 1 tsp salt 1 1/2 c Crisco 1 egg 1 tsp vinegar 6 Tbsp water</p> <p>FILLING: 5-6 c apples 3/4 c sugar 2 Tbsp flour 1 tsp cinnamon dash nutmeg & salt 2-3 Tbsp butter cinnamon & sugar</p>	<p>For crust, mix together flour and salt. Cut in Crisco till crumbly. Add egg, vinegar, and water and use a fork to combine. Do not over mix. Creates 4-6 crusts.</p> <p>For filling, peel and slice apples. Combine with sugar, flour, cinnamon, nutmeg, and salt.</p> <p>Roll out and place one crust in the bottom of a pie plate. Add filling. Top with small squares of butter.</p> <p>Roll out and place one crust on top. Pinch edges and cut slits into the middle of the crust. Sprinkle with cinnamon and sugar.</p> <p>Bake for 15 min @ 415° and then 45 min @ 350°.</p>	

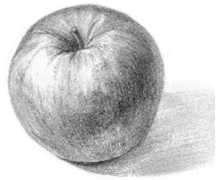
Our curriculum project is: Scrumdiddlyumptious

Musical dimensions; singing and playing instruments

In P.E, we will be learning about

Ball skills.– how to throw and catch a ball, how to dribble a ball; working collaboratively as a team, emotional resilience.



In P.S.H.E / R.H.E , we will be learning about

Being in My World— Celebrating individuality including who we are and what makes us special. Explaining how being unique is part of life and links to our diversity beliefs within our Trust.

In R.E, we will be learning about

Hinduism and the celebration of Ganesh Chaturthi. We will find out about the importance of the Hindu god Ganesh and the activities which take place during this festival.

In Computing, we will be learning about

Online safety and coding - recognising how to keep ourselves safe on the internet and keeping personal information private. Designing, writing and debugging computer programs.
